## MATERIALS NEEDED:

RED HEART ${ }^{\circledR}$ Soft Baby Steps ${ }^{\circledR}$ : 2
balls each 9401 Elephant A, 9700
Baby Pink B, 9600 White C
Susan Bates ${ }^{\circledR}$ Circular Knitting Needles: 5.5mm [US 9] 29" long

Yarn needle, stitch markers
GAUGE: 16 sts = 4" [10 cm] in Garter Stitch and 24 rows $=4$ " $[10 \mathrm{~cm}$ ] for one Ripple Pattern repeat. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needle to obtain the gauge.

RED HEART ${ }^{\circledR}$ Soft Baby Steps ${ }^{\circledR}$, Art. E746 available in solid color 5 oz (141 g), 256 yd ( 234 m ); prints 4 oz (113 g), 204 yd ( 187 m ) balls

Blanket measures: $36^{\prime \prime}$ wide $\times 36^{\prime \prime}$ (91 cm x 91 cm )

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS
K2tog = Knit 2 stitches together. Insert the right needle into two stitches at the same time and knit. This will result in a decrease of one stitch. This decrease will slant to the right.
YO = Yarn over needle

## STITCH

Garter Stitch = Knit every row.

## RIPPLE PATTERN (over 12 sts)

Row 1: Knit across row.
Row 2: Purl across row.
Row 3: *(K2tog) twice, (yo, K1) 4 times, (K2tog) twice*, repeat from * to end.
Row 4: Knit across row.
Repeat Rows 1-4 for Ripple Pattern.

Blanket is worked back and forth on circular needle, do not join.

## TIPS \& HINTS

Join a new ball of yarn when there are color changes and/or approximately 6 " $[15 \mathrm{~cm}$ ] of yarn left from the old ball. Weave these ends in neatly on the wrong side of the fabric in a zigzag pattern for a few inches, and then trim off excess.

## BLANKET

With A, cast on 150 sts.
Rows 1-5: Work in Garter st (3 ridges).
Cut $\mathbf{A}$ and attach $\mathbf{B}$.
Next Row: With B, K3, place marker, work Ripple Pattern to last 3 stitches, place marker, K3.
Note: Continue to work K3 on first and last 3 stitches on every row to establish border pattern and work Ripple Pattern inside markers.
*Continue in pattern until 8 rows (2 repeats) have been worked.
Next Rows: Cut B and attach C. With
C, work in Garter st 4 rows (2 ridges).
Next Rows: Cut C and attach A. With
A, work in Ripple Pattern until 12 rows (3 repeats) have been worked.
Next Rows: Cut A and attach C. With
C, work in Garter st 4 rows (2 ridges).
Repeat from * until 7 full repeats
have been worked.
Next Rows: Cut C and attach B. With B, work 8 rows in Ripple Pattern. Next Rows: Cut B and attach A. With A, knit 6 rows in Garter st. *Bind off 6 sts, k2tog, bind off the k2tog; repeat from *, binding off remaining sts at end. This keeps bind off from being too loose.

FINISHING: Weave in ends.

## BLANKET

With A, cast on 150 sts.
Rows 1-5: Work in Garter st (3 ridges).
Cut $\mathbf{A}$ and attach $\mathbf{B}$.
Next Row: With B, K3, place marker, work Ripple Pattern to last 3 stitches, place marker, K3.
Note: Continue to work K3 on first and last 3 stitches on every row to establish border pattern and work Ripple Pattern inside markers.
*Continue in pattern until 8 rows (2 repeats) have been worked.
Next Rows: Cut B and attach C. With C, work in Garter st 4 rows (2 ridges).
Next Rows: Cut C and attach A. With A, work in Ripple Pattern until 12 rows (3 repeats) have been worked. Next Rows: Cut A and attach C. With C, work in Garter st 4 rows (2 ridges).

Repeat from * until 7 full repeats have been worked.
Next Rows: Cut C and attach B. With B, work 8 rows in Ripple Pattern. Next Rows: Cut B and attach A. With A, knit 6 rows in Garter st. *Bind off 6 sts, k2tog, bind off the k2tog; repeat from *, binding off remaining sts at end. This keeps bind off from being too loose.

FINISHING: Weave in ends.

balls 9620 Baby Green

## Susan Bates ${ }^{\circledR}$ Circular Knitting Needles: 5.5mm [US 9] 29" long

Yarn needle, Stitch markers
GAUGE: 17 sts $=4^{\prime \prime}$ [ 10 cm ]; 20 rows = $4^{\prime \prime}$ [ 10 cm ] in Stockinette Stitch.
CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needle to obtain the gauge.

## RED HEART ${ }^{\circledR}$ Soft Baby Steps ${ }^{\circledR}$,

Art. E746 available in solid color 5 oz (141 g),

Ivy Lace Pattern

Key

## STITCH PATTERNS

## Seed Stitch

Row 1: *K1, p1, k1; repeat from * to end of row.
Row 2: Knit the purl sts and purl the knit sts, as they appear.
Repeat last row for Seed St. Pattern.
Ivy Lace Pattern (multiple of 11 sts) Row 1 and every following alternate row (Wrong Side): Purl.
Row 2: *K2tog, k4, [yo, k1] 2 times, ssk, k1*
Row 4: *K2tog, k3, yo, k1, yo, k2, ssk, k1*
Row 6: *K2tog, k2, yo, k1, yo, k3, ssk, k1*
Row 8: *K2tog, [k1, yo], 2 times, k4, ssk, k1*
Row 10: *K2tog, yo, k1, yo, k5, ssk, k1*
Row 12: Repeat Row 8.
Row 14: Repeat Row 6.
Row 16: Repeat Row 4.
Row 18: Repeat Row 2.
Row 20: *K2tog, k5, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k1*

NOTES

1. Blanket is worked back and forth in rows on circular needles, do not join.
2. Borders and main body of blanket are worked at same time in one piece.

## TIPS \& HINTS

Join a new ball of yarn when there are approximately $6 "$ [ 15 cm ] of yarn left from the old ball, also leaving a $6^{\prime \prime}[15 \mathrm{~cm}]$ tail of yarn with the joined yarn. Weave these ends in neatly on the wrong side of the fabric in a zigzag pattern for a few inches, and then trim off excess.

## BLANKET

Cast on 156 sts.
Rows 1-8: Work in Seed Stitch pattern for bottom border.
Row 9 (Right Side): Work 6 sts in Seed Stitch pattern for border, K1, work in Ivy Lace Pattern to last 6 sts ( 13 repeats), work 6 sts in Seed Stitch pattern for opposite border. Note: Place stitch markers between side borders and center panel of Ivy Lace Pattern to mark where borders begin and end. Also place stitch markers every repeat of Ivy Lace Pattern to keep track of pattern repeats.
Next Rows: Repeat Ivy Lace Pattern rows 1-20-9 times.
Next Rows: Work 8 rows in Seed Stitch pattern for bottom border. Bind off all sts in Seed Stitch pattern.

FINISHING: Weave in ends. Block lightly to measurements.

CABLE PANEL (worked over 12 sts): Rows 1, 5, 7 (Right Side): P2, K 8, P2. Rows 2, 4, 6: K2, P8, K2.
Row 3: P2, slip next 4 sts onto a cable needle and hold at
front of work, K 4 , then K 4 from cable needle, P2.
Row 8: K2, P8, K2.
PLUME PANEL (worked over 17 sts):
Row 1 (Right Side): P2, K13, P2.
Row 2: K2, P13, K2.
Row 3: P2, K4tog, [yo, K1] 5 times, yo, K4tog, P2.
Row 4: K2, P13, K2.
Blanket measures 37 " x 42 " ( $94 \times 107$ cm)

Row 2: Slipping markers as you come to them, K6, * work
Cable Panel Row 2 over next 12 sts, K4, [work Plume
Panel Row 2 over next 17 sts, K4]
twice, work Cable Panel
Row 2 over next 12 sts, K4; repeat from * twice more, K2.
Continue as established until 41"
from beginning, ending with Row 8 of Cable Panel and Row 4 of Plume Panel, decreasing 8 sts evenly spaced on last row - 222 sts. Knit 8 rows. Bind off. Weave in ends.

Row 3: K1, knit in front and back of next 4 sts. (increase 4), K1-10 sts.
Row 5: K4, YO, K2, YO, K4-12 sts.
Row 7: K4, YO, K4, YO, K4-14 sts.
Row 9: K4, YO, K6, YO, K4-16 sts.
Row 11: K4, YO, K8, YO, K4-18 sts. Continue to work in this way adding 2 more stitches on every Right Side row until there are 90 sts. total, end with a Wrong Side row.
Next Row (Right Side): K4, YO, slip
1, K2tog, pass slip stitch over K2tog (SK2P), K to last 7 sts, SK2P, YO, K4.
Next Row (Wrong Side): Knit.
Repeat last 2 rows until 12 sts remain, end with a right side row.
Next Row: K4, K2tog twice, K4-10
sts.
Next Row: K3, K2tog twice, K3-8
sts.
Next Row: K2, K2tog twice, K2 - 6
sts.
Next Row: K1, K2tog twice, K1-4 sts.
Bind off remaining 4 sts.
FINISHING: Weave in ends.

One 7/8" (22mm) diameter button, stitch holders, yarn needle

GAUGE: 22 sts = 4" [10cm]; 28 rows = 4 " [10cm] in Stockinette Stitch using larger needles. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.

RED HEART ${ }^{\circledR}$ Baby TLCTM, Art 258 available in solid color 5 oz (141g), 358 yd ( 328 m ) and Multicolor 4 oz (113g), 242 yd (222m) balls

Chest: $191 / 2(20,201 / 2,22,23,25) "$ [49.5 (51, 52, 56, 58.5, 63.5) cm] Length: 8 (9, 10, 11, 12, 13)" [20.5 (23, $25.5,28,30.5,33) \mathrm{cm}$ ]

## BACK

With smaller needles and $\mathbf{A}$, cast on $50(54,56,60,64,68)$ sts.
Work in Garter st for 8 rows, increasing 2 sts on last row - 52 (56, $58,62,66,70$ ) sts.
Change to larger needles and St st and work until piece measures 8 ( 9 , $10,11,12,13)$ " $[20.5$ ( $23,25.5,28,30.5$, $33) \mathrm{cm}$ ], end with a wrong side row. Bind off.

## LEFT FRONT

With smaller needles and B, cast on 25 ( $27,28,30,32,34$ ) sts.
Work in Garter st for 8 rows, increasing 2 sts on last row - 27 (29, $30,32,34,36)$ sts.
Row 1 (Right Side): Change to larger needles and knit.
Row 2: K6 for Frontband, purl to end.

Repeat Rows 1-2 until piece measures $4^{1 ⁄ 2}\left(5^{1} 12,6^{112}, 7112,8^{1 / 2} 2\right.$, $91 / 2$ )" $[11.5(14,16.5,19,21.5,24) \mathrm{cm}]$ from beginning, end with a wrong side row.
Change to C and repeat Rows 1-2 until piece measures 6 ( $7,8,9,10$, 11)" [15 (18, 20.5, 23, 25.5, 28) cm], end with a right side row.

## Shape Neck

Bind off 8 (9, 9, 9, 10, 10) sts at beginning of next wrong side row for Neck - $19(20,21,23,24,26)$ sts, Working in St st, decrease 1 st at Neck edge every other row 5 ( $5,5,5$, $5,6)$ times - $14(15,16,18,19,20)$ sts. Work until piece measures same length as Back.
Bind off.
(Continued)

Row 2: Purl to last 6 sts, k6 for Frontband.

Change to $\mathbf{D}$ and repeat Rows 1-2 until piece measures $51 / 2(61 / 2,71 / 2$, $81 / 2,91 / 2,101 / 2$ )" [14 ( $16.5,19,21.5,24$, 26.5) cm] from beginning, end with a right side row.

Buttonhole Row (Wrong Side): Purl to last 6 sts, k2, k2tog, yo, k2.
Repeat Rows 1-2 until piece measures $6(7,8,9,10,11)$ " [15 (18, $20.5,23,25.5,28) \mathrm{cm}$ ], end with a wrong side row.

## Shape Neck

Bind off 8 ( $9,9,9,10,10$ ) sts at beginning of next right side row for Neck - 19 (20, 21, 23, 24, 26) sts, Working in St st, decrease 1 st at

Neck edge every other row 5 ( $5,5,5$, $5,6)$ times - $14(15,16,18,19,20)$ sts. Work until piece measures same length as Back.

Work as for Back until piece measures 2 rows before beginning of Armhole shaping, end with a wrong side row.

## Shape Neck

Remove markers as you work the next row.
Row 1 (right side): Bind off $7(8,8,9)$ sts, knit to last $9(10,11,12)$ sts, [k1, p1] twice, k3 (4, 5, 6), p2-12 (12, 13, 13) sts.

Row 2 (wrong side): K2, p2tog through back loops, p2 $(3,4,5)$, [k1, p1] $2(1,1,1)$ time(s), k0 (1, 1, 0), p2tog through back loops-10 (10, 11, 11) sts.

Row 3: K3 (2, 2, 1), [p1, k1] twice, k1 ( $2,3,4$ ), p2.

## Size 6-12 months only:

Row 4: K2, p2tog through back loops, [p1, k1] twice, p2tog through back loops-8 sts.
Row 5: K2, [p1, k1] twice, p2.
Size 12-24 months only:
Row 4 (wrong side): K2, p2tog
through back loops, p2, k1, p1, p2tog through back loops-8 sts.
Row 5: [K1, p1] twice, k2, p2.

## Size 2-3 years only:

Row 4 (wrong side): K2, p2tog
through back loops, p3, k1, p1, p2tog
through back loops-9 sts.
Row 5: [K1, p1] twice, k3, p2.

Size 3-5 years only:
Row 4 (wrong side): K2, p2tog
through back loops, p4, k1, p2tog
through back loops-9 sts.
Row 5: K2, p1, k4, p2.

## All Sizes:

Work even in Stockinette st until armhole measures $41 / 4(41 / 2,5,51 / 4)^{\prime \prime}$ ( 10.5 (11.5, 12.5, 13.5) cm); end with a wrong side row.
Bind off.

## LEFT SLEEVE

With smaller needles, cast on 27 (29, 31,33 ) sts.
Work in Seed st for 8 rows.
Change to larger needles.
Beginning with a right side (knit) row, work in Stockinette st for 2 rows.

## Baby Lace Cardigan <br> (Continued)

Increase Row (right side): K1, M1, knit to last st, M1, k1-29 (31, 33, 35) sts.
Work even in Stockinette st for 9 rows.
Repeat last 10 rows $2(3,4,5)$ more times-33 $(37,41,45)$ sts.
Work even in Stockinette st until piece measures $73 / 4(81 / 4,81 / 2,9)$ " ( $19.5(21,21.5,23) \mathrm{cm}$ ) from beginning; end with a wrong side row.

## Shape Raglan Edges

Row 1 (right side): Bind off 2 sts, knit to end of row-31 ( $35,39,43$ ) sts.
Row 2: Bind off 2 sts, purl to end of row-29 $(33,37,41)$ sts.
Row 3 (decrease row): P2, k2tog, knit to last 5 sts, ssk, p2-27 (31, 35, 39) sts.

Row 4: K2, purl to last 2 sts, k2. Repeat last 2 rows $8(9,10,11$ ) more times-11 $(13,15,17)$ sts; end with a right side row.

## Shape Cap

Row 1 (decrease - wrong side): Bind off $5(6,7,8)$ sts, purl to last 2 sts, k2-6 $(7,8,9)$ sts.
Row 2 (decrease - right side): P 2 , k2tog, knit to end of row-5 $(6,7,8)$ sts.
Bind off.

## RIGHT SLEEVE

Work same as Left Sleeve to Shape Cap; end with a wrong side row-11 $(13,15,17)$ sts.

## Shape Cap

Row 1 (decrease - right side): Bind off $5(6,7,8)$ sts, knit to last 2 sts, p2-6 (7, 8, 9) sts.
Row 3 (decrease - wrong side): K2, p2tog through back loops, purl to end of row-5 $(6,7,8)$ sts. Bind off.

## FINISHING

Block pieces to measurements shown on schematic. Weave in ends. Sew shoulder seams. Sew Left Front and Right Front raglan edges to front raglan edges of Sleeves. Sew Back raglan edges to back raglan edges of Sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams. Sew buttons to left front band, opposite the buttonholes on right front.

Round 11: *With C, k2; with B, k1; with C, k1; repeat from * around. Cut
B.

Round 12: With C, knit.
Round 13: *With A, k1; with C, k3; repeat from * around.
Round 14: *With A, k2; with C, k1; with $\mathrm{A}, \mathrm{k} 1$; repeat from * around. Cut C.

Work remainder of hat with A only.
Rounds 15-22 (26): Knit.
Note: Piece should measure about 5 (6)" (12.5 (15) cm) from beginning.

## Shape Crown

Note: When stitches no longer fit comfortably on circular needle, change to double pointed needles. Round 1: *K6, k2tog; repeat from * around-63 (70) sts.
Round 2: Knit.
Round 3: *K5, k2tog; repeat from * around-54 (60) sts.
Round 4: Knit.
Round 5: *K4, k2tog; repeat from *
around-45 (50) sts.
Round 6: Knit.
Round 7: *K3, k2tog; repeat from * around-36 (40) sts.
Round 8: Knit.
Round 9: *K2, k2tog; repeat from * around-27 (30) sts.
Round 10: Knit.
Round 11: *K1, k2tog; repeat from * around-18 (20) sts.
Round 12: *K2tog; repeat from * around-9 (10) sts.
Cut yarn, leaving a long tail. Thread tail through remaining stitches and remove them from the needles. Pull to close opening at top of hat. Draw tail to wrong side and weave in very securely.

## FINISHING

Weave in all ends. Block lightly, if desired.

Row 1 (Wrong Side): Slip 1 wyif, p5. Row 2 (Right Side): *Slip 1 wyib, k5. Repeat Rows 1-2, 1 time more.

## Heel

Continuing on needle \#2 only.
Row 1 (Wrong Side): Slip 1 wyif, p3, p2tog, turn.
Row 2 (Right Side): Slip 1 wyib, k2, ssk, turn.
Row 3: P2, p2tog, turn.
Row 4: K1, ssk-2 sts remain. Do not turn.

## Gusset

With right side facing, using needle \#2, pick up and knit 4 sts along the edge of the Heel Flap. Using new needle, knit across needle \#3 and needle \#1 combining sts onto one needle. Using another needle, pick up and knit 4 sts along opposite side of Heel Flap, then knit across first st of heel. The two needles hold 5 sts each and third needle holds 6 sts- 16 sts. The new beginning round is at the center of the heel (between the two needles that have 5 sts each).
Work Heel Gusset decrease rounds as follows:

## Round 1:

New Needle 1: Knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1.
New Needle 2: Knit all sts.
New Needle 3: K1, ssk, knit to end.
Round 2: Knit all sts.
Repeat Rounds 1-2 until 12 sts re-main-3 sts. on needles \#1 and \#3, 6 sts on needle \#2.

## Foot

Work even until foot measures $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ [ 6 cm ] from picked up Gusset sts.

Rows 26-28: Repeat Rows 2-4.
Row 29: K1, K2 tog across to last st, K1: 8 sts.

Cut yarn, leaving a $15^{\prime \prime}$ ( 38 cm ) end for sewing. Thread yarn needle with the end and weave through remaining stitches, draw up firmly; fasten securely. With right sides together, weave seam.

## FINISHING

Thread a yarn needle with the long end. With wrong sides of two Body pieces together, sew seam 4 " (10 cm ) down from top edge, around bottom and other side to $4^{\prime \prime}$ (10 cm ) below top edge. Leaving a $3^{\prime \prime}$ ( 8 cm ) arm opening on each side, sew remaining $1^{\prime \prime}(3 \mathrm{~cm})$.
